Shirley dedicated her life to Jehovah and was baptized as one of Jehovah's Witnesses on July 11, 1969.

With modesty and humility Shirley did everything with passion, love and a zest for life, her loving nature and overall care for others was infectious. 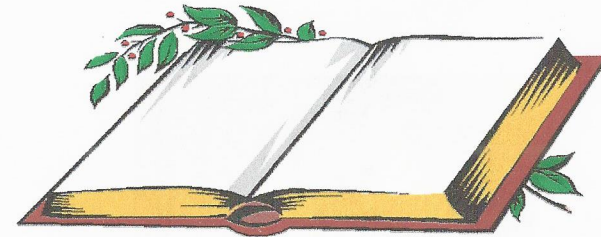
